

Environmental Justice

The just treatment and meaningful involvement of all people, regardless of income, race, color, national origin, Tribal affiliation, or disability, in agency decision-making and other Federal activities that affect human health and the environment so that people:

- (i) are fully protected from disproportionate and adverse human health and environmental effects (including risks) and hazards, including those related to climate change, the cumulative impacts of environmental and other burdens, and the legacy of racism or other structural or systemic barriers; and
- (ii) have equitable access to a healthy, sustainable, and resilient environment in which to live, play, work, learn, grow, worship, and engage in cultural and subsistence practices.



BSEE is in the process of developing an EJ strategy and action plan that integrates environmental justice considerations into bureau decision-making and other activities.

The effort is guided by various executive orders, Department of the Interior (DOI) policy, and other related initiatives, including

- <u>Executive Order 12898</u> Federal Actions to
 Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations
- <u>Executive Order 13985</u> Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities Through the Federal Government
- Executive Order 14008 Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad
- <u>Executive Order 14096</u> Revitalizing Our Nation's Commitment to Environmental Justice for All
- 2023 Ocean Climate Action Plan (OCAP), Ocean Justice
 Strategy, and National Strategy for a Sustainable Ocean Economy
- DOI 2022 2026 Strategic Plan and previous DOI EJ strategic plans
- DOI EJ Implementation Policy, 525 DM 1
- DOI EJ Strategic Plan
- BSEE 2023 -2026 Strategic Plan
