NOTICE TO LESSEES AND OPERATORS OF FEDERAL OIL AND GAS AND SULPHUR LEASES IN THE OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF

Invitation to Minerals Management Service (MMS)/Industry Performance Measures/Best Practices Workshops

I am writing to ask you and your company to send representatives to one of two, 1-day workshops that the MMS will co-sponsor this November. These workshops will present the results of our first Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) safety and environmental performance measures survey. Operators representing over 80 percent of all OCS production responded to this survey and have provided the industry and MMS with some valuable insights on the state of safety and environmental performance.

The workshops will also promote best practice sharing by highlighting the management approaches taken by pacesetting companies of different sizes. Pacesetting operators were chosen in two categories: those producing greater than 30 million barrels of oil per year and those producing less than this amount. Two pacesetters, one from each category, will present an overview of the management systems they use to achieve their good performance in the following areas: production and construction personnel safety; drilling personnel safety; prevention of oil spills and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System noncompliances; and MMS regulatory compliance.

I urge you to review the attached workshop announcement and registration form. The announcement provides additional detail about the workshops. This information will also be posted for your convenience on the MMS Safety Page (http://www.mms.gov/eod/safety.htm) under the "Performance Measures" section. Space is limited in each workshop, so I encourage you to confirm your registration as soon as possible. MMS/INDUSTRY PERFORMANCE MEASURES/BEST PRACTICES WORKSHOPS ANNOUNCEMENT

You and other interested members of your company are invited to attend one of two Safety and Environmental Management Program (SEMP) Performance Measures and Best Practices Workshops that will be held in November 1998. Those who should attend are company and contractor personnel (management and staff) accountable and/or responsible for safety, environmental, and regulatory performance, including personnel who develop and implement safety and environmental safety and environmental processes.

As a followup to the two performance measures workshops held in 1997, MMS solicited performance measures data for the years 1996 and 1997 from operators on the OCS. That data has been compiled and will be presented at the 1998 workshops. The goals of the 1998 workshops are to:

- 1. share the performance measures data,
- 2. have the pacesetter companies share the process that helped them to achieve superior performance,
- 3. share approaches to auditing SEMP and lessons learned,
- 4. review changes in the recently released Second Edition, API RP 75 (SEMP) and the results of the 1997 SEMP Survey, and
- 5. highlight different ways to achieve good performance by operators of different sizes.

These workshops will provide a great opportunity for attendees to hear <u>how</u> the pacesetters achieved superior performance. The attendees may want to adopt some of the pacesetter's processes to enhance their company's safety and environmental performance. The workshops will also provide the opportunity to network with other operators about the processes they use for safety and environmental management programs.

Attached for your information is a preliminary agenda for the workshops.

The first workshop will be held at the Fairmont Hotel in New Orleans on Tuesday, November 10, 1998. Because of a large convention in New Orleans that week, hotel rooms are extremely scarce throughout the city. If you need a hotel room, you should try to locate one ASAP or plan to attend the workshop in Houston.

The second workshop will be held at the Sheraton North Hotel (formerly Sheraton Crown Plaza) in Houston on Thursday, November 12, 1998.

The registration fee includes a continental breakfast, lunch, and afternoon refreshments. The registration fee is \$75 for those who register by October 12, 1998. For those who register after October 12, 1998, including those who register at the workshop, the registration fee is \$100. To enroll, complete and return the attached registration form along with your registration check. Each meeting begins at 8:30 a.m. and concludes no later than 4:30 p.m. The breakfast and registration begin at 7:30 a.m. A preliminary agenda will be mailed to all registrants.

If you do not have a copy of API Recommended Practice 75, Second Edition, July 1998, order forms will be available at the workshop.

Workshop attendance is limited to 300 in New Orleans and 240 in Houston. Registration will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis. Cancellations will be accepted with full refunds up to November 1, 1998. No refunds will be offered after November 1, 1998. Should a registrant not be able to attend, substitutions will be allowed to attend in the registrant's place.
