# NATIONAL NOTICE TO LESSEES AND OPERATORS OF FEDERAL OIL AND GAS AND SULPHUR LEASES IN THE OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF

### **Revised Assessment Matrix**

The purpose of this Notice to Lessees and Operators (NTL) is to provide updated information in the BOEMRE OCS Civil Penalties Program. This NTL replaces the assessment matrix provided in NTL No. 2007-N02. The Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA 90) requires the Secretary of the Interior to adjust the maximum civil penalty to reflect any increases in the Consumer Price Index.

In accordance with OPA 90 and the Office of Management and Budget guidelines, BOEMRE has increased the maximum amount of the civil penalty to \$40,000 per day per violation. The assessment matrix below, revised to reflect the increased maximum penalty, will apply to any violation occurring on or after July 30, 2011.
