At the OTC SAFE luncheon, MMS will also present Corporate Leadership Awards to outstanding individuals whose exceptional performance has raised the bar for safety achievement, improved environmental protection, enhanced resource recovery and conservation, or inspired innovation and outstanding performance by others.
